Stone City Bottled Water Company



PERSONALIZING LABELS FOR BOTTLED WATER.

Stone City Bottled Water is not new to the beautiful and historic rolling hills of Stone City. The company has been personalizing business and consumer events with custom label bottled water since 2006. Libby L. Boge owns and operates the business from her residence located outside of Stone City on the Ridge Road.

When asked how she came about personalizing labels for bottled water she said, "Since Stone City has such great tasting water; I researched setting up a manufacturing facility to bottle water and personalize the labels. The cost and risk were too high but the idea stuck." Instead, the company gets 100% spring water in 16.9 oz bottles from an Iowa based plant.

Stone City Bottled Water started out by designing a label for unlabeled bottled water and outsourcing the printing. However, by the end of 2007, the company had purchased equipment to create, print and apply labels in-house. The owner states, "New printing technology allows short runs for full color labels. Before I purchased the

printer, the customer had to purchase 1,000+ labels to be cost effective. It limited my sales to the larger companies and corporations. Now I can print 24 labels on up at the same price. This allows smaller businesses and individuals to personalize there events with bottled water." She adds, "In addition, the printer is photo quality. For example, you can put an engaged couple's photo on the label and have personalized bottled water at the wedding." She also adds, "This has been a big hit with weddings, graduations and reunions."
